

### ESTHER'S JOURNEY

As the ferry reached the port city, Esther\* could still see both her homeland and her new land. Her past and her future. Her very long journey had both ended and begun at the same time.

Coming from a Muslim background, Esther started a journey in her late teens, passionately searching on the internet for a God that she had been educated about since birth. Her family enforced the religion's strict rules in their home, leaving her heart completely void. Her months of searching online for answers only increased her emptiness. She abandoned hope of ever really knowing God personally. Perhaps He did not exist?

Then it happened. In a chatroom visit, Esther was directed to a local pastor named Mordi,\* who is supported by The Joshua Fund. Esther had so many questions, and Pastor Mordi and his wife joyfully and patiently shared answers from the Word of God. They poured into Esther's life, taking time to love, minister and walk her through the deep wonderings of her heart. It was now settled. She would follow Jesus and leave behind the religion of her family.

Her new transformation was noticeable to all, including her family. Beaten and abused, she was severely threatened. But her love for Jesus would not allow her to go back. She knew she would lose her family, her schooling and her current identity.

With that she fled one night to the home of Pastor Mordi. Secretly he and his wife sheltered and cared for her. Eventually Esther returned clandestinely to the internet, where an online romance blossomed with a young Christian man from a neighboring Muslim nation. Pastor Mordi, acting as her father, received this young man for a visit to evaluate if he would be a suitable husband for Esther. And he was.

Pastor Mordi and his entire family protected and escorted Esther to the shores of the new port city. Esther now has a new husband, new country, new family and a new life in Christ.

Pastor Mordi and his family are living examples of the many pastors and ministry workers The Joshua Fund has the privilege of assisting through your support. These faithful ministers remain in difficult places, sharing the Gospel. Yet, your gifts enable us to offer them some hope and support as they labor in the harvest fields of the Middle East.

### LEVI MEETS THE MESSIAH

Levi\* is a young Israeli who was raised in a believing family, attending a Messianic congregation. After recently completing his mandatory service in the Israel Defense Forces (IDF), Levi participated in a vital discipleship program run by Tikvah – a Joshua Fund partner ministry. Tikvah provides an environment outside of Israel where young adults can grow in their faith and experience the healing and restoration they so often need after serving in the IDF.


Each year, 200-300 young Israelis from believing families enter the army. During this time, many can grow cold in their relationship with God. Others fall prey to temptation. Still others face such difficult adversities that they question whether they ever had their own personal relationship with Yeshua (Jesus). The daily questioning and challenges from religious or secular Jewish youth in the IDF only heightens their confusion.

As their IDF service concludes, these young people question their relationship with God. They may struggle with guilt or shame and be reluctant to re-enter the believing community. Unsure where to turn, some wonder if God is simply finished with them. Almost all young Israelis leaving the IDF travel the world to recover from the military experience and to retreat from Israeli society in general. They desperately need relief. At this critical juncture, Levi turned to Tikvah and found just what he needed!

The Joshua Fund has long been aware of this significant need among the youth in Israel. This summer, we were thrilled to support the first Tikvah session in England. Seven Israeli young people, including Levi, gathered for a six-week discipleship program in a setting that gave them a chance to rest, decompress and bond together. It was a wonderful time of deeply personal ministry – including one-on-one discipleship, encouragement and intimate fellowship. These sessions gave Levi and the others a chance to relax and to explore Scripture in a very loving, relaxed and non-threatening setting.

Levi came to the program with many unanswered questions, unsure of where he stood in his faith. Over the six weeks, however, many answers became clear to him. By the end of the session and after hearing many testimonies from other visiting pastors and ministry workers, this young man made a personal decision to commit his life to Yeshua and ask him to be his Savior and Lord!

# THE SLEEPING HEART OF A BEDOUIN WOMAN

The Bedouins are a grouping of nomadic Arab people who historically inhabit desert regions. It's not well known that the Bedouins also call Israel home.

If you'd like to learn how to survive in the Israeli desert, a great place to start would be amongst the Bedouin tribes in the south of Israel. Sadly, the nomadic culture is often connected to crime. Many Bedouin men are highly abusive towards women. They frequently practice polygamy, having children with multiple wives, and in many cases they only provide for the children of their "favorite" wife. Meanwhile, these women are bound to their "homes," which are simple makeshift shacks. There they live in the desert, typically with no utilities, little money and little contact with the outside world.

THE DEEP AND LASTING RELATIONSHIPS THESE BEDOUIN WOMEN ARE BUILDING WITH CHRISTIANS WHO SHOW THEM CHRIST'S LOVE, WILL HELP TO EMPOWER THEM AND SLOWLY TRANSFORM THEIR HEARTS.

In a village in the south of Israel, most Bedouin children do not attend school. They are too often left hungry with little hope for the future. However, in this particular community, a Messianic Jewish pastor teams up with Mary\* and other Arab believers to serve the Bedouin's "poorest of the poor."

By special permission of the Sheik, or tribe chief, this tribe's women are allowed to leave their home for a weekly meeting with the Messianic congregation's members. This is, in itself, evidence of God's hand as Bedouin tribes are exclusively Muslim. It is in this congregation where Mary and other women teach the Bedouin women how to read and write. There they learn other life skills, including how to express their feelings. This is not traditionally allowed among Bedouins.

Most of the moms who receive food packs donated from The Joshua Fund are married to men who have taken on more wives, and have left them to take care of their children. These women are essentially single mothers, forbidden to work as they live in the middle of the desert. Visiting with the local believers is one of the highlights of their week.

One of them recently admitted, "This is the one time a week in which I laugh." While laughter is important, The Joshua Fund knows that the deep and lasting relationships these Bedouin women are building with Christians who show them Christ's love will help to empower them and slowly transform their hearts. Additionally, the training will provide them valuable literacy skills that will serve them and their children for years to come!

### PARTNERING TO MAKE A DIFFERENCE

Hear the story of one such couple, Paul and Jenny Biederman, who joined us on a recent Joshua Fund Prayer & Vision Tour.

"It was our first time in Israel and we had waited a long time to go," says Jenny. "You are so overwhelmed with the sights, the sounds and the history, and the faces. We loved the service day, [where needy families are invited to receive household goods purchased by The Joshua Fund]. There were different stations of clothing, blankets, frying pans, and coffee pots. It was almost like being at a bridal shower....We had a little area set up with coffee and tea and cookies."

"I couldn't speak Hebrew or Arabic, but I could speak a little bit through translators" Jenny continues. "I just hugged the ladies, smiled at them, and loved on them. One particular lady was glowing, she couldn't stop smiling, and she didn't want to leave. That touched my heart. I felt that she was blessed and it was neat to see that."

Admittedly, Jenny's husband Paul came hesitantly. However, once he arrived in Israel something started to happen. "The reason it took us awhile to get there is because I was dragging my feet for 10 years and my dear wife kept encouraging me...I think just the goodness and sovereignty of the Lord let us go with The Joshua Fund."

"It was such a blessing," Paul adds. "It was probably the highlight of our life. It's changed our life in many ways. Spending time with Joel and Lynn is wonderful. Worshipping on the Mount of Olives and looking out over the city of Jerusalem, it's profound. Rubbing shoulders with the ministry leaders is unique to The Joshua Fund. It's really meaningful and you walk away encouraged spiritually. We were encouraged by The Joshua Fund and the ministry that's going on there."





**PRAY** that God would continue to raise up people around the world who will faithfully intercede for God's work in the Epicenter.


