MY INSIGHTS FROM ISRAEL

This August we celebrate three vears of living in the land of Israel as new citizens. We have been studying the language, navigating everything from travel soccer to hospital emergency rooms, building new relationships and establishing our family in our local congregation. It has been a real joy to find ways to personally serve the believers here in Israel and learn more about the needs of this complex land. Adjusting to life here has been a challenge and a continuing education. We are learning to pray more specifically for the obstacles Israelis face.

Being a Jewish believer in Israel is not easy, as many face rejection and/or persecution from their families, friends and society. There is a spiritual darkness, an extra hardness toward the gospel that can feel oppressive. Many young people face demonic attack in their unbelieving homes. The culture in the army is extremely challenging, and many come out of their service traumatized by the promiscuity and pressures in addition to any physical dangers and stress. Young believers often feel they did not stand strong in this atmosphere, gave into temptations and are spiritual failures. Our country is also full of people still recovering from the trauma of the Holocaust. Children and grandchildren of survivors often have been raised in very dysfunctional homes.

Young believers from every background need to be welcomed into community and begin a process of very intentional discipleship if they are not to feel isolated. For new believers, everything in their world has been turned upside down, and they need to know they are not alone and not "crazy." Each person needs to experience forgiveness, understanding and acceptance into the family of God. It is exciting to see the many ways the believing community is reaching out to disciple new believers and young people. There are regular national conferences and events for youth, for soldiers and for young adults. One Joshua Fund ministry partner offers a one-year study program that gives young people a solid foundation in their faith. Several ministries have designed special discipleship programs for young people about to enter their military service and for those just ending their time in the Israel Defense Forces. These are crucial times to equip and encourage young people to stand firm in their faith. Of course, it is our prayer that the congregations in the land continue to grow strong and healthy and walk alongside new believers in their midst. With four sons, we have been deeply and personally grateful for these ministries that have welcomed, equipped and encouraged them.

Will you join us in praying that the Lord will birth a renewed focus on discipleship in the congregations and new endeavors to do so effectively? What an honor and responsibility it is to spiritually parent new children of God. We must hold these servants up in prayer and ask the Lord of the harvest to raise up still more.

Throughout the year, holiday-based outreaches provide many Israeli and West Bank believers with occasions to open their homes to neighbors and friends. Jewish celebrations and feasts, such as Passover and Succot, as well as Christian celebrations of Christmas and Easter, which are celebrated among Arab believers in the region, often provide a chance for the Word of God to be shared with those who don't know the Lord personally. There are also more coordinated events where congregations, churches or local ministries gather to draw the community together to share a time of feasting, biblical teaching and true worship. While some efforts focus on those from specific backgrounds, such as Holocaust survivors, or Russian or Arabic speakers from nominal Christian backgrounds, many have come to know the Messiah through spending time among His people as well as through the resulting longer-term relationships that our brothers and sisters seek to cultivate.

Each Mother's Day, celebrated in Israel on the first day of spring, there is a special outreach that gathers over 800 Arabic-speaking women from both Christian and Muslim backgrounds to honor and encourage women in their roles within their families. Can you imagine how this effort shines as a 'flower in the desert' when set against a culture where the women's God intended role is often obscured?

Many attend the gathering with their own mothers or daughters and are deeply touched, as they are taught from the Scriptures, ministered to and prayed for personally by the believers in attendance. This single event each spring provides a tremendous opportunity for the believing women who organize and host the celebration to cultivate and develop relationships throughout the year. No small number of women are entering the Kingdom through the love of God that is displayed!

REMEMBERING OUR

On June 14th of 2006, a small group of us gathered in our home to sign the paperwork and officially begin The Joshua Fund, to bless Israel and her neighbors in the name of Jesus. We gathered there with a few trusted friends who had already been praying and serving together in the Epicenter for several years. As our first board of directors was founded that night, we expectantly asked the Lord to use us in a new way to be a part of what He was doing.

It is amazing to look back and see God's faithfulness since then. Psalm 32:8 says, "I will instruct you and teach you in the way which you should go; I will counsel you with My eye upon you." And in Jeremiah 33:3 we read, "Call to Me and I will answer you, and I will tell you great and mighty things, which you do not know." He has done great things!

Joel had been writing books since 2001 and the novels were generating an ever-growing interest from American and Canadian Christians who wanted to invest their resources to bless Israel and her neighbors. We began with two specific financial gifts given to us unexpectedly for the purpose of translating and freely distributing Joel's book, *The Ezekiel Option*, which has a strong gospel message, into Hebrew and Russian. As this fledgling organization began to plan its first projects, a war in southern Lebanon erupted. While Hezbollah and Israel fought in July and August of 2006, millions of civilians on both sides endured displacement and danger.

We sought the Lord to see how we might help bring the hope of Christ to people in distress. In what became the hallmark of our approach, we found trusted and experienced believers in the region whom we could invest in, pray for and encourage. The Lord has a remnant of His church even in the most difficult places, and we need to be a part of strengthening what remains (Revelation 3:2).

By God's grace we were able to supply followers of Christ caught in the conflict with practical resources which they could use to serve their neighbors. We also sought to educate and mobilize the church in North America towards prayer for the region.

Since we began, our mission has been to "bless Israel and her neighbors in the name of Jesus." We do that by providing humanitarian aid,



strengthening local congregations and mobilizing the global church to "learn, pray, give and go" to the Epicenter.

In the letter to the Romans, chapter 16, Paul describes the amazing community that God has provided for him as: fellow workers, beloved, hard workers, approved in Christ, kinsman, brothers, sisters, chosen in the Lord, helpers, saints and servants. This is how we see the whole Joshua Fund team that God has raised up, from donors to staff to members of our board to our partners in the field.

As we move forward into the myriad of unknowns in the next ten years, let's keep clinging to what we know. God is faithful. He deeply loves Israel and her neighbors more than we ever could.

May He alone be glorified!



MINISTERING HOPE Among the bedouins

he Joshua Fund partners each month with local congregations and ministries in Israel to help feed those who are most in need. Among the neediest and neglected in Israel are the Bedouin people. Bedouin tribes have the highest growth rate among all ethnic groups, doubling every 15 years, and represent about one in four people in Israel's Negev Desert. Bedouin husbands typically marry many women but financially support only their favorite wife and children, leaving other wives to fend for themselves – and their children.

The Joshua Fund is grateful to partner with a ministry of local Jews and Arabs dedicated to distributing food and ministering hope to these abandoned women and children.

REPORTS FROM THE NEIGHBORING NATIONS





Lebanon has now reached a point where almost half of the country's population consists of refugees. There is such a great need in so many capacities, especially spiritually. Pray with us and our ministry partners as we seek the Lord on how best to share the Good News in this vacuum.

One of our ministry partners in Lebanon reports, "Our advice would simply be, do not depend on oneself, rather on the Lord alone. Consider every attack a chance to get to know the Lord more and His attributes. The most important thing is to have a heart and attitude full of holiness. Let our behavior and our reactions be a redemption to this fallen world. The way I deal with God in the midst of my failures reflects how I am going to deal with Him when I am at the summit of my success. The ground of failure is the most fertile land to cultivate success. Please pray with us, visit us more often and stand by us."



Jordan remains a good example of tolerance in the Muslim world. However, behind the scenes the secret police monitor much of the ministry activities within its borders. This limits the actual evangelism opportunities. Local churches are still under a "four-wall" mentality, and reaching out to the lost is scarce. Combined with any hint of conversion to Christianity, the challenges are great to reach the 98% of Jordan's population who don't know Christ. However, the refugee crisis has afforded an opportunity to reach out to these lost people.

According to a Jordanian ministry worker, "One man that we have known for a while is now a believer coming from another religious background. It has been encouraging to see his growth during our weekly meetings with him. Recently he said if he had stayed in the country he fled from, he would never had heard about Jesus. He never saw a Bible until coming here. He said anyone seen with a Bible in his town would have been killed."

3 | EGYPT

Egyptian Christians continue to be the primary victims of attacks from religious radicals, whose method of targeting believers in the Middle East was highlighted at the Palm Sunday church bombings. Even further attacks were conducted on innocent churchgoers traveling by bus. Overnight, the remote desert location of this vicious slaughter became the ill-famed scene that claimed the lives of 28. Although our hearts are broken for the church in Egypt, we have been blessed for years to come alongside our brothers and sisters in this ancient biblical land.

Through your gifts and prayers, The Joshua Fund has helped support a large scale discipleship program among the Egyptian youth, through a local organization and church, which gladly reported, "Thousands of high schoolers and older college-age young people in Egypt are being established in their identity as followers of Christ. From systematic Bible study and sound teaching...many in fact, are coming to faith for the first time. One key element of our program is evangelism. We want to make sure that there is a constant and continual emphasis and opportunity made for young people to make personal commitments to receive and follow Christ as their Lord and Savior. One specific time where there is always great response in commitments is the annual summer conference."



C SYRIA IS CURRENTLY HOME TO PERHAPS THE WORST MAN-MADE HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN WORLD HISTORY. HUNDREDS OF THOUSANDS HAVE LOST THEIR LIVES, WHILE MILLIONS HAVE BEEN PUSHED FROM THEIR HOMES.



Syria is currently home to perhaps the worst man-made humanitarian crisis in world history. Hundreds of thousands have lost their lives, while millions have been pushed from their homes. The church of Jesus Christ has also suffered great loss and persecution during this horrific six-year conflict. To come alongside and encourage the body of Christ in Syria we recently supported a gathering that was hosted by one of our ministry partners for church leaders and pastors. This time was set aside to equip these kingdom warriors through worship, prayer, fellowship and an extended time together in God's Word.

One of our friends in Syria reports: "The retreat came at the perfect time for all 120 workers who arrived from the front lines. It's hard to fathom how physically, emotionally, and spiritually exhausted these precious servants of the Lord were. There is no place to go in Syria to escape that war. There are just places that are less intense... It was the first time that leaders from a Christian background, Sunni Muslim background, Druze background, and Alawite background gathered together."



Iraqi Christians by the thousands annually flee their homeland due to ongoing war, persecution and life's insecurities that have battered their country for the last two decades. Only the Lord's remnant remain, as some report that less than 30 evangelical churches continue serving in the entire country. Over the course of the last ten years, thanks to your faithful prayers and support, we have been able to encourage and equip some of those faithful church leaders who persist in the work of the Lord in this war-weary field:

"When we received word of your gift the pastors here asked why you were doing this? What is leading you to continue to support us in such a way? We are so encouraged by your love!" writes an Iraqi Pastor.

Today, through your generous gifts, we continue to stand with the shepherds of God's flock in this country whose original name means "deep roots."
